(1) Discuss the pharmacokinetic properties, dosing, efficacy data, and safety profile of ticagrelor, (2) Describe the indications, dosing, adverse effects, and clinical studies for dabigatran and rivaroxaban, (3) Review the implications for use of new anticoagulants in special populations, including the elderly, (4) Identify additional anticoagulants and the clinical studies ongoing for these future agents.

Technician Objectives:

(1) Review the newly approved antiplatelet agent, ticagrelor, (2) Discuss the newly approved anticoagulant dabigatran and important safety considerations surrounding its use, (3) Describe key information about the newly approved anticoagulant, rivaroxaban.

Stick it to Diabetes: Insulin Pen Incorporation and Adherence

(1) Identify currently available insulin pen devices, (2) Discuss the advantages and disadvantages of insulin pen devices with vial and syringes, especially within the elderly population, (3) Describe the use of insulin pen devices in a variety of health care settings.

Risk Assessment and Management of Osteoporosis

(1) Identify the impact, incidence and prevalence of osteoporosis, (2) Assess fracture risk in patients with osteoporosis, (3) Review nonpharmacologic and pharmacologic treatment strategies for preventing osteoporotic fractures.
